The 20th of October and we have already had a frost delay! Way too early for this. Hopefully this is not a sign of the winter we are going to have, but who knows? These things happen then the next day we are back in shorts. Talk about playing with your emotions. Texas weather has got to be the most out of control weather.

We were fortunate enough to finally receive some good rain this month. Nothing close to what we really need, but it helped. It couldn't have came at better time since the irrigation pump had another major breakdown. Just like any other industry, parts and materials are hard to come by. As of today, we have been without water for 2 weeks and still have another week till we can get it running again. It's been tough but the course is holding up well. We've done everything we can just to keep moisture on the greens. In all honesty we have no way to really irrigate when these things happen. The focus at this time is really only on the greens.

As soon as irrigation is up and running, we will start our pre-emerge application for winter weeds. Hopefully we can control the poa on the greens better than last year. The greens are healthier going into winter than last year, meaning we can be a bit more aggressive than last year. I'm confident that this winter we will be able to stay on top of that issue. I know that it is unsightly and not a fair roll.

This month we would like to welcome back Charles Hall. Charles is no stranger to Webb Hill. He recently retired from Ennis Tag and Label after over 40 years. Throughout that time, he worked here at the Hill doing just about anything. I'm looking forward to getting to work with Charles again, and I know he's a great fit.


October's events were well attended! Thank you to all who participated. We appreciate your support so much. It is so good to see more and more of you using your membership as this COVID mess slowly subsides.
