Tips from the Pro by Max Langston

Most beginner golfers take up golf with outdated equipment. They take to the course not knowing how to properly grip a club, stance, or swing the club. The result is trying to shoot under 130. This is frustrating and usually leads into learning from videos and being self taught, repeating bad habits and fully understanding Einstein Theory...doing the same thing over and over expecting different results. Beginner's first course of action is to get proper training from a certified instructor/professional to learn proper technique, etiquette, and course management. Fitting the student into proper equipment, it's hard enough to hit a golf ball, but with the right equipment it gets easier. The goal is to hit less bad shots, and the reality of it, there's plenty of them no matter what your skill level is. Direction and course management are the key factors at the beginner level. If you're serious about learning this game, book lessons with a certified instructor/professional, use the practice range and putting green. It will save you time and money, and get you started in the right direction to enjoy this wonderful game of golf.

Here we go again. I feel like it's the same thing as last time I did the newsletter. Cold and windy on the hill. This time it's colder than the last. Temperatures have gotten as low as 10 degrees with a wind chill below zero. I believe the news said -4. This is the kind of weather we expect in February that I mentioned. I had a feeling we weren't out of the clear just yet.

I have been monitoring the green covers from a distance as to not walk on frozen turf with the exception of one area on the practice green. I'm happy to say that the temperature below was 40 degrees with the outside temperature being 13. That's in a spot that was being pummeled by heavy winds too. We are hoping that the whole green is staying this warm. As the days warm up above freezing I will continue to check more areas. With it being this cold and windy we still may have some issues. Time will tell but I feel very confident we are going to bounce right back. Leading up to this occurrence the greens had already began to show signs of health and were greening up.

We have had plans of repairing several areas of concrete this winter and still hope we can. Things don't always work out, and I can say we may be getting going on mowing before we know it. That won't be a problem because I can't wait to smell some fresh cut grass. I know these guys are ready too. The weather has even delayed our pre-emergent applications this season. Lots of poa annua has started to pop up in last several weeks throughout the course. I have everything here for it but just need cooperation from mother nature. The greens have remained very clean and that's the main area of concern.

When you finally get out you will see we have removed a tree on right side of 16 green. This tree has been on my list since I started but never was sure if I wanted to actually do it. The roots of the tree were leading into the green and taking moisture and nutrients away from the green as well as causing issues with acorns. I think this area will look great this season.
